



Micro-Community Scholarship Program at Pres House Apartments



We're so glad you're interested in being a Micro-Community at Pres House Apartments. The Micro-Community program is our signature program for **groups of residents** applying to do a scholarship together.

Purpose:

Being a Micro-Community is a way to make your experience living at Pres House more meaningful. Members grow closer with each other and with the community, developing leadership and organizational skills while exploring a meaningful topic of interest. Each group chooses a theme or topic of focus for the year. The group members then share responsibility for planning and executing activities at least once a month around their topic. At least one to two of these activities must be open to the broader PH Apartments community; the rest are usually internal to the group.

Micro-Community Topic Ideas:

The following list summarizes types of projects residents have undertaken; this list is not exhaustive and your own ideas are encouraged.

- A group focused on promoting global citizenship through appreciation of cultures, global economic and environmental realities, and cross-cultural communication.
- A group focused on developing a particular set of skills, habits, or appreciation for arts
- A group focused on learning and doing something about a pressing issue such as human trafficking, the incarceration industry, climate change, or homelessness.
- A group committed to encouraging healthy habits that promote wellness for themselves and among Pres House residents.
- Your own idea of a living/learning/service community that develops deep and meaningful relationships within the group and meets a need on campus, in the wider community, or in the world.

Support from Pres House:

Participants in the Micro-Community will receive a rent credit scholarship (up to \$75/participant per month). Groups report regularly to, and receive support from, the Coordinator of Residential Programs (CRP), but the responsibility for the community and its programs will be primarily in the hands of the group itself. As part of its proposal a group may request up to an additional \$300-500 of program support funds for event supplies, special meals, travel, speaker fees, or other program expenses. Each group member must participate in all aspects of the proposed program in order to receive the rent credit scholarship throughout the year.

How to Apply:

Applications are available with the beginning of leasing season, typically in October. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis, with 4-5 projects being funded in a typical year. Interviews will be conducted as applications are received. Those who are interested in another scholarship program may apply for both programs and places will be held until a decision is made about the Micro-Community application. Residents cannot be a part of two scholarship programs at the same time, except in special circumstances. Every group member must sign a lease in Pres House Apartments. Lease application must be done separately from applying to be a Micro-Community.

Group Make-Up:

Groups may be from 4 to 8 people in size. Members typically live in a shared apartment, although they can include 1-2 members living in another Pres House Apartments unit. **You may sign a group lease or individual leases in advance of being accepted as a Micro-Community as long as you understand that there is no guarantee your Micro-Community application will be approved.**

The ideal Micro-Community proposal will:

- State a clear and meaningful topic of focus for the Micro-Community being proposed.
- Propose activities and initiatives that will:
 1. facilitate connection and personal growth among members;
 2. provide opportunities for others living at Pres House to engage in your project;
 3. educate, engage, or meet some need of the campus and/or surrounding community.
- Be clearly thought out and well-articulated.
- Include a prospective budget for activity supplies & other expenses.
- Include a plan to self-evaluate the Micro-Community and address issues as they arise
- Identify how Micro-Community will share and delegate leadership / accountability.

V. BUDGET

- 1. Rent reduction.** All Micro-Community members receive a rent scholarship applied to their lease. This scholarship is typically \$55-\$75 per month per participant, contingent upon Pres House Apartments funding and the number of micro-communities being funded. Based on the number of people in your group, calculate the high and low ends for your group's total rent credit funding.

$$\$75 \text{ per month} * \frac{\quad}{(\# \text{ of members})} = \$ \frac{\quad}{(\text{group monthly})} \text{ per month} * 12 \text{ months} = \$ \frac{\quad}{(\text{group year total})} \text{ total}$$
